In an increasingly digital world, staying vigilant against scams and fraudulent activities has become more important than ever before. Scammers are constantly evolving their tactics to

trick individuals, including our members, out of their hard-earned money and personal information. As part of our commitment to the safety and well-being of our members, I want to share some insights about current popular scams and how you can protect yourselves.

Phishing Emails and Texts: Be cautious of unsolicited emails or text messages claiming to be from legitimate organizations such as government agencies, popular online platforms, or even Coloramo. These messages often request personal information, passwords, or financial details. Always verify the sender's authenticity before responding or clicking on any links.

Online Shopping Scams: When shopping online, ensure you're using secure websites with [https://]https:// and a padlock symbol in the address bar. Be wary of deals that seem too good to be true, especially from unfamiliar sites. Research the website's reputation and read reviews before making a purchase.

Tech Support Scams: Scammers may impersonate tech support agents and claim that your computer has a virus or other issues. They may ask for remote access to your computer or payment for services. Legitimate tech support companies will never contact you unsolicited; only seek help from trusted sources.

Social Engineering and Impersonation: Criminals may impersonate family members, colleagues, or friends to manipulate you into sending money or sensitive information. Always double-check the identity of the person through a separate, private channel before taking any action.

Investment and Crypto Scams: Be cautious when receiving unsolicited investment opportunities,

including cryptocurrency schemes that promise quick profits or require upfront payments. Always research and verify investment companies before handing over money.

Romance Scams: Scammers build emotional connections online, only to exploit them for financial gain. Be cautious when interacting with individuals you've met online or through social media platforms. I recommend not sending money to anyone you haven't met in person.

Your safety is our top priority, and we encourage you to share these insights with your friends and family members to help create a more informed and secure digital community.

Get Festive With This Simple Fall Recipe!

NO-BAKE PUMPKIN ENERGY BITES INGREDIENTS:

- 1 ½ to 2 cups dry, uncooked oatmeal
- ½ cup pumpkin puree
- ¼ cup chia seeds
- √2 cup all-natural peanut butter or other nut or sun butter
- ¼ cup quality honey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon or pumpkin pie spice
- ½ cup mini dark chocolate chips

INSTRUCTIONS:

In a medium bowl, add 1 ½ cups oats, peanut butter, pumpkin, chia seeds, honey, vanilla, and cinnamon. Stir to combine well (it should stick together when rolled but still feel tacky on your hands. Add remaining oats if needed). When the mixture is workable, add the chocolate chips and stir to combine. Scoop a large spoonful into your hand and roll into balls. Repeat with remaining dough. Enjoy! Keep these in the fridge for up to a week, or in the freezer for longer.
